The Plank Road Folk Music Society proudly opens it's 11th concert season by presenting an evening with Sparky and Rhonda Rucker on Saturday, October 3, 8 pm at Sokol Hall, 3907 Prairie, Brookfield.

After 25 years of international touring, eight record releases, and mainstage credits at every major folk festival in the United States and Canada, Sparky Rucker is now recognized as a leading performer and commentator on African-American folk culture. Sparky is appreciated for his deft abilities as a singer, historian, folklorist, storyteller, and down-home humorist. Rhonda Rucker is an incredible musician with special gifts for playing African-American mouth harp styles and creating wonderful vocal harmonies.

"Their music is a blend of blues, country, folk and gospel, the stories are ones your great-grandparents may have passed down through the generations." says the Mississippi Valley Blues Society of Davenport, Iowa.

The Charleston, S.C. Evening Post has said, "Sparky Rucker is a phenomenal stage presence who not only is capable of bridging black-white cultural ties, but also is adept at bringing the whole of the folk-music spectrum to bear on...the rich historical and artistic treasure of the country and blues vocal archive."

His wife Rhonda Rucker, accompanies him with harmonica and back-up vocals, and is featured on Sparky's last two recordings.

Harmony Singing By Ear

Beginning on Saturday, September 19 at 11 am, Tom, Cathy and Ann Jones will coach a class in 2,3 and 4 part singing; traditional style. No experience necessary, but it helps if you can carry a tune. We're now accepting registration, tuition is \$40 for an 8 week class.

Private/Group Instruction

Of course, the Jones continue their family tradition of offering some of the best music classes around. We'll gladly instruct all levels of students from complete beginners on up on the following instruments: guitar, banjo, mandolin, fiddle, hammered and mountain dulcimer and auto harp. Please give us a call.

New Format for Students

One lesson each month will be a student jam session will all instruments and all other students taking lessons that night. Jams will be held the first Monday, Wednesday and thursday of each month. We've found these to be popular among students, and a great way to begin learning how to play with other musicians in a classroom setting.

Basic tuition of \$45 includes 4 private or 6 group lessons and any jam sessions offered during your enrollment.

Mark Dvorak & Friends to celebrate PRFMS anniversary, album release at Sokol Hall on November 14

The Plank Road Folk Music Society will celebrate it's 11th anniversary with a very special evening featuring folksinger and Plank Road co-founder Mark Dvorak on Saturday, November 14, 8 pm at Sokol Hall, 3907 Prairie Avenue, Brookfield.

Dvorak helped found "the Old Quarter" coffeehouse which produced music events in various formats locally until 1987. He was then named to the first board of directors of the Plank Road Folk Music Society in 1986, an organization which picked up where "the Old Quarter" left off.

Since that time, his singing and recording career has brought him across the continental United States and has produced two albums. His 1988 Depot release, "No Lonesome Tune" was received favorably, and remains popular among Chicago area listeners and students of folk music.

Dvorak will perform selections from his newest album, "Use It Up, Wear It Out," which was released on Depot earlier this month.

"It's a 'patchwork quilt' of songs--some of which have been with me for awhile, and some which are new--which have come from both friends and heroes of mine," says Dvorak. "It's turned out to be a very personal album."

Joining Dvorak for the evening will be a host of special guests, all of whom contributed in some way to the album. Plank Road favorite Marianne Mohrhusen is scheduled to join Dvorak on stage and Milwaukee songwriter and poet laureate Larry Penn will make an appearance. Acoustic bluesman and national steel guitarist Ted Parrish, who fronts his own band, the Bucktown Barbeque Boys, will make a special solo appearance as will Irish flutist and vocalist Catherine Hall.

Singer/guitarist George Mattson, a brilliant performer and song interpreter who coproduced "Use It Up, Wear It Out" with Dvorak will open the show.
